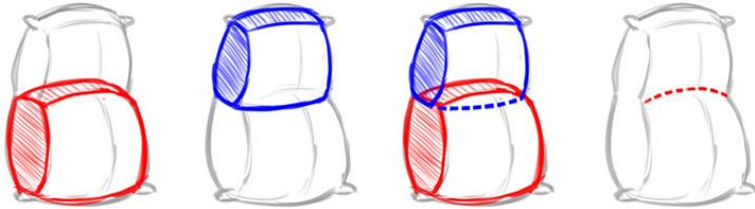


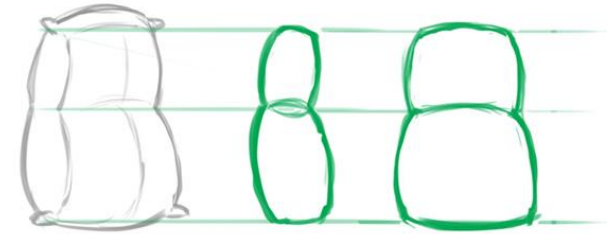
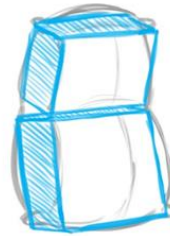
Think about the flour sack as constructed out of two main shapes, top and bottom. They are best described as blocks with curved faces.



These shapes overlap a bit in the middle.

Usually it's best to show this fold/crease curving up.

This can help to emphasize that the bottom of the sack is a little bigger.



There will be a more mass on the bottom shape as gravity drags the "flour" down.

If you struggle to work with curved objects, it can help to work with more geometric, flat-edged blocks. You can always draw on top of this later to make it look more like a flour sack.

It helps a lot to think of what the flour sack looks like from different angles.
